



Food Safety Specialist

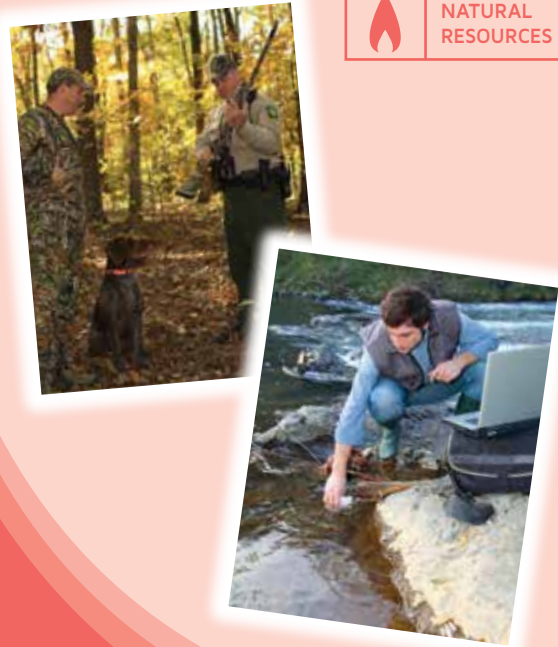
ensures that food is processed, packaged, and prepared to the food preparation and food safety standards set by the company and regulatory organizations.

Landscape Designer

Sales Representative: Feed and Animal Health

sells and provides service for feed and animal healthcare products produced by their company for the animal industry.

Veterinarian Technician

assists Veterinarians in procedures such as physical exams, dental procedures, spaying and neutering, immunizations, and euthanasia.

Additional careers:

Animal Biotechnologist – Reproductive or Nutritional Specialist, Animal Caretaker/Operations Manager, Feedlot Manager, Livestock Buyer, Meat Processor & Inspector, and Veterinarian.



Service Technician

performs diagnosis and repairs on engines, transmissions, and various agricultural or lawn and garden equipment.

Welder

connects and fuses steel framework for buildings, machines, and other equipment.

Additional careers:

Carpenter/Laborer, Electrical Engineer, Electrician/Electronics Technician, Hydraulics Technician, and Truck Driver.



Sales Representative

responsible for an assigned territory and product they must market to agricultural suppliers, dealers, or producers.

Commodity Merchandiser

in charge of customer account management and locating, trading, and purchasing one or more commodities for their company.

Additional careers:

Ag Financial Service Representative, Certified Appraiser, Customer Service Representative, Farm Business Manager / Accountant, Grain Elevator Manager, Human Resources Generalist, Public Relations Specialist, Logistics and Supply Chain Management, Marketing Specialist, Sales Representative, and Warehouse/Facility Manager.



Environmental Engineer

investigate issues within the environment and design solutions in areas such as water, air pollution, and waste management.

Environmental Scientist & Specialist

direct and support land and nutrient management operations to comply with company programs and regulatory requirements.

Additional careers:

Environmental Compliance Officer, Environmental Science and Protection Technician, and Nutrient Management/Waste Management Specialist.
